Nonprofit Parent Pathways Adds New Board Members

Parent Pathways, the Denver nonprofit that helps teen parents raise healthy families, has added three new members to its Board of Directors: Donna Hultin, Diane Kane and Helen Salazar Martin.

Donna Hultin, a former schoolteacher, was a member of the Board of the Florence Crittenton Home for Unwed Mothers, which operated for more than 80 years before closing in 1981, three years before the Parent Pathways' Florence Crittenton School opened under the name "Teen Parent Education Network." Hultin has done volunteer recruitment and fundraising for Denver Girls, Inc., and Denver Boys, Inc., now combined as Denver Kids, Inc., a preventive counseling and mentoring program for students who attend Denver Public Schools. She was Executive Director when she retired in 2008.

Diane Kane, MD, is a pediatrician for Kaiser Permanente Colorado, and a member of the Colorado State Board of Medical Examiners. She has received several awards for performance and dedication to her field.

Helen Salazar Martin, a partner at M Squared Public Relations and Marketing, has been in the marketing, public relations and business development field for more than 25 years, most recently as Development Director for Arrupe Jesuit High School, an inner-city high school serving low-income youth. She was Vice President of Business Development and Marketing for Golden Banks of Colorado (now Wells Fargo), Senior Vice President at Compass Bank in the Business Banking area, and also worked for UMB Bank and United Banks of Colorado.
